



THE PROBLEM WITH COASTAL FISHERIES

More than a billion of the world's most climate vulnerable people depend on coastal fisheries for their main source of animal protein. These fisheries provide:

- Half of the world's fish catch.
- 80-90% of employment to the fisheries sector.
- The majority of **ecosystem services** in the form of coral reef systems, climate resilience, or mangrove habitat.





SOLVING THE J-CURVE

Small-scale fisheries have both a governance and economic problem



- Fragmented, inefficient, and low-integrity supply chains.
- Lack of quality products
- High levels of spoilage and unused by-products
- Over-reliance on a few species
- Out-dated or absence of infrastructure
- Limited access to capital




