# Southeast Asia: Hotspot for plastic and overfishing

- 3.35 million artisanal reef fishers (50%+ of global total) live in Southeast Asia and depend on declining fish stocks
- Over 75% of the Philippines' fishing grounds are depleted, while the country is the third worst plastic polluter globally
- 640 metric tons of fishing gear is abandoned in the ocean every year
- Most communities have no sustainable way of disposing of or recycling their used fishing nets
- Discarded fishing nets continue to kill and injure marine life (through phenomenon known as ghost fishing)

## Reducing plastic, replenishing fish and lifting coastal communities out of poverty. Supported by business model:

Creating efficient community -based supply chains

Apply the principles of fair trade and inclusive business to create efficient community-based supply chains for raw materials (currently nylon-6 and carrageenan) abundantly available in coastal communities.

Link them to conservation actions that reduce plastic pollution and replenish fish stocks.

Increasing incomes combined with behaviour change campaign reduces demand for single-use plastic sachets by increasing the accessibility of higher-volume packages in a given purchase Selling raw materials into global supply chains

Target brands looking to source premium ingredients with a positive social and environmental story - sell raw materials into global supply chains

Provide fishing communities and conservation agencies with alternative income/revenue streams to break the boom and bust nature of donor dependance.

Together, this ensures the sustainability of bigger and better Marine Protected Areas that replenish fish stocks and increase resilience of coastal communities. Managing local supply chains with new community banks

Set up community banks to manage the local supply chains, using Village Savings and Loan Associations (VSLA) methodology

The community banks are the 'social glue' at the heart of Net-Works. Banks bring communities together in informal cooperatives and give people much needed access to financial services.

We have collected 208,240 kilograms of **nets** since 2012.

We have set up 97 community banks since 2012.
